If you are a Christian Scientist, you look to 1879 as the year in which your religion was born and to Mrs. Baker Eddy as it's founder.

If you worship with the Salvation Army, your sect began with William Booth in London in 1865.

If you belong to the American Catholic Church, your religion came into being in the early 1960's, at Vatican II, which was a conclave of Catholic Bishops, Catholic Cardinals, and Protestant advisors.

If you belong to one of the religious organizations known as "Church of the Nazarene, Pentecostal Gospel, Holiness Church, Pilgrim Holiness Church, Jehovah's Witness" your religion is one of the hundreds of new sects founded by men within the past fifty years.
